A Civil War-era fort, hiking trails, picnicking areas, fishing & more

Chinatown

Center on Beach Street
Border Boston Common, Downtown Crossing, South End, and the Southeast Expressway/ Massachusetts Turnpike

Waterfront Boston

Waterfront
Harbor walk, Harpoon Brewery, Fort point, Chirldent of Museum. Nice borders like Seaport District and South Boston

North End (Italian Town)

One-square-mile Waterfront Area
Known for fine dining, amazing cafes, delicious gelato, and colorful personalities

Skywalker Observatory

800 Boylston St, Boston MA 02199
Only sky-high vantage point for sweeping 360 degree views of Greater Boston

New England Aquarium

1 Central Wharf, Boston MA 02110
A global leader in ocean exploration and marine conservation

South End/Back Bay

Lies to South End, South Boston
Fine dining, art galleries, open market; famous one: SOWA (South of Washington Area), between Albany to Washington & E. Berkeley to Mass Ave

Museum of Science

1 Science Park, Boston MA 02114
Over 700 interactive exhibits, a number of live presentations every day

Museum of Fine Arts

465 Huntington Avenue, Boston MA 02115
One of the largest museums in the USA. Contain more than 450,000 artworks. One of the most comprehensive collections in the Americas

Fenway Park

4 Yawkey Way near Kenmore Square
A baseball park and home of the Boston Red Sox Major League Baseball team since 1912 and the oldest ballpark in MLB

Massachusetts State House

24 Beacon St Beacon Hill, Boston 02133
The dome, original made of wood shingles, is now sheathed in copper and covered by 23 karat gold that was added to prevent leaks. Land was once owned by MA first elected governor, John Hancock

Cape Cod/ Martha's Vineyard/ Nantucket

A cape in Atlantic Ocean
Whaling and trading areas, resort destinations, attracting wealthy families, celebrities, and other tourists, including the large nearby islands of Martha's Vineyard and Nantucket

Six Flags New England

1623 Main St, Agawam MA 01001
New England's biggest, most popular theme park featuring dozens of thrill rides, shows, and activities

Quabbin Reservoir

800 Boylston St, Boston MA 02199
The largest inland body of water in the Commonwealth of Massachusetts and it is the primary water supply for Boston along with the Wachusett Reservoir

Salem (Witch City)

Salem MA 01970
House of the Seven Gables, Peabody Essex Museum and many more

Plymouth

Plymouth MA 02360
Plymouth Rock, Plimoth Plantation, Pilgrim Hall Museum

Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame

1000 Hall Fame Ave, Springfield MA 01105
Honors extraordinary basketball players, coaches, referees, executives, and other major contributors to the game of basketball worldwide

Intersection of Massachusetts Avenue, Brattle Street, and John F. Kennedy Street, Cambridge MA 02138

Harvard University

Harvard Square
Tourists often rub the toe of John Harvard's left shoe for luck

King Bhumipol Square

Eliot Street and Bennett Street, Cambridge MA 02138
Commemorate the birth of His Majesty King Bhumibol Adulyadej of Thailand at Mount Auburn Hospital

Mount Auburn Hospital

330 Mt Auburn St, Cambridge MA 02138
His Majesty King Bhumibol Adulyadej was born on December 5, 1927 while his father, Prince Mahidol, was a student at Harvard Medical School

MIT Chapel (Buidling W15)

50 Massachusetts Ave, Cambridge MA 02139
Located on the campus of the Massachusetts Institute of Technology (MIT), well known as a breeding ground for technology and technologists

Fogg Museum

32 Quincy St, Cambridge MA 02138
Harvard's oldest art museum

Brattle Theatre

40 Brattle St, Cambridge MA 02138
A small movie house with one screen, rarely remaining for movie theaters that use a rear-projection system; the projector is located behind the screen rather than behind the audience
Foreign, independent, and classic films

Cambridge Common

1667 Massachusetts Ave, Cambridge MA 02138
The borders on several parts of Harvard University. Popular place to play kickball, softball, soccer, and frisbee

Fresh Pond

A reservoir and park in Cambridge
A 2.25 mile (3.6 km) perimeter road popular with walkers, runners and cyclists, and a nine-hole golf course

Charles River Reservation

Between the Charles River Dam and the Eliot Bridge
A 17-mile (27 km), a Massachusetts state park, located along the banks of the Charles River in Boston, Cambridge, Water-town, and Newton

FREEDOM TRAIL

The Freedom Trail is a 2.5-mile-long (4 km) **Red** (mostly brick) **Path** through downtown Boston, that leads to 16 significant historic sites; the birth of American liberty. A Visitor Center is on the first floor of Faneuil Hall, where they offer tours, give out free maps of the Freedom Trail and other historic sites, and sell books about Boston and US history.

- Sixteen stops are Boston Common, State House, Park Street Church, Granary Burying Ground, King's Chapel, Benjamin Franklin's Statue Site, Old Corner Bookstore, Old South Meeting House, Old State House, Boston Massacre, Faneuil Hall (Quincy Market), Paul Revere House, Old North Church, Copp's Hill, Burial Ground, USS Constitution, Bunker Hill Monument.
